1. Miami's in-state students receive an Ohio Resident Scholarship for \$2,500 and an Ohio Leader Scholarship ranging from \$2,500 to \$3,100 per semester. These scholarships reduce Miami's net instructional and general fees for resident undergraduates to an average of \$4,521 per semester.

2. Shawnee State has a separate out-of-state fee of \$ for residents of Mason, Lewis, Boyd, and Greenup counties in Kentucky, and Cabel and Wayne counties in West Virginia.

3. Akron offers an out-of-state surcharge of \$ for academically qualified students.

4. Youngstown State has a separate out-of-state fee of \$1,236 for residents in its Regional Service Area, which is defined as Chautauqua County in New York; Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Clarion, Crawford, Erie, Fayette, Forest, Greene, Indiana, Jefferson, Lawrence, Mercer, Venango, Warren, Washington, and Westmoreland counties in Pennsylvania; and Brooke, Hancock, Marshall, and Ohio counties in West Virginia.
