

Student Diversity on Ohio's State-Supported Campuses

Questions: What races and ethnic backgrounds are represented on Ohio's college campuses? What percent of Ohio undergraduates are out-of-state or foreign students? What percent of undergraduate students attend college part-time? What percent of undergraduate students are older than age 24? How many high school students attend classes at Ohio's public campuses as part of Post Secondary Enrollment Option, a program which gives students the opportunity to earn college credits before graduating from high school? How well do they perform? These are all questions pertaining to student diversity. How does Ohio undergraduate student diversity compare to the nation's undergraduates or to Ohio's resident population? Has it changed over time? How does undergraduate student diversity vary by type of college or institution?

Why ask about student diversity? For some students, college is the first time they are exposed to other students who are of different races, come from different states or countries, or have family concerns and responsibilities that are different from their own. For other students, college represents a continued exposure to others who look different, come from different cultures, or have different family responsibilities. Prospective students and their families may make choices about a college or university based upon the diversity of a campus's undergraduate population.

National Answers: The undergraduates enrolled in Ohio's state-supported colleges and universities are similar to their national counterparts. The exception to this is that the Hispanic student population in Ohio is much more similar to the Hispanic resident population in Ohio than the nation. The Ohio undergraduate population appears to be trending younger, just as the national undergraduate population is moving proportionately in the same direction.

Statewide Answers: There is diversity in Ohio's undergraduate population. The greatest proportion of Ohio's state-supported undergraduate students is white and traditional in age (younger than age 25). The statewide percentage of part-time undergraduate students and the percentage of students over age 24 are higher in Ohio than the national average.

Sector Answers: There is great variation in selected diversity measures among Ohio's academic year 2001 undergraduate population by type of college. Community colleges have the greatest diversity of undergraduate students (undergraduates = 74% white and 18% black) and are serving many non-traditional students (undergraduates over age 24 = 52%; undergraduate part-time students = 69%). Variability on these measures is evident across the types of colleges. 83% of undergraduate students on public university main campuses are 24 years of age or younger.

Sector Answers Regarding High School Students Enrolling for College Courses: In fall 2000, high school students were enrolling for college coursework while still in high school in all sectors of Ohio's colleges. On average, students were registering for two or three courses (six to nine semester hours) that term and were achieving average grades of B or better in those courses (3.0 gpa or higher). The persistence rate of high school students (the rate at which these students return the following year to college) was highest at Ohio's community colleges and university branches (75% and 74% respectively) and lowest at Ohio's technical colleges (63%).

Campus Answers Regarding Diversity and Campus Answers Regarding High School

Students Enrolling for College Courses: There is great diversity among Ohio's undergraduate population by institution and by campus. There is also great diversity among Ohio's institutions and campuses in the enrollment and success of high school students taking college courses while still completing high school.

- Cuyahoga Community College's Eastern and Metro Campuses have the greatest percentage of non-white (or foreign) undergraduates of all two-year colleges (58% and 66% non-white respectively). Central State University, Ohio's only historically black public university, serves the greatest percentage of non-white undergraduates (98% non-white or foreign), although the actual number of undergraduates at Central State is the smallest (1,333 undergraduates total) of all four-year campuses.
- Cuyahoga Community College's Eastern Campus has the highest percentage of part-time undergraduate students in the state at 81%. The institutions having the lowest percentage of part-time undergraduate students are Bowling Green State University, Miami University and Ohio University, all at 7%.
- The Metro and Eastern Campuses of Cuyahoga Community College have the highest percentage of undergraduate students over age 24 among two-year institutions at 63%. Cleveland State has the highest percentage of undergraduate students over age 24 among university main campuses at 42%.
- Lorain Community College has the largest number of PSEO students enrolled on its campus, followed by the University of Toledo and Lakeland Community College.
