RE: PROGRAM APPROVAL AUTHORIZATION PROCESS

On June 26, 2009, the Miami Jacobs Career College (MJCC) was granted provisional authorization by the Chancellor of the Ohio Board of Regents for the following programs:

- Associate of Applied Business in Office Management
- Associate of Applied Business in Medical Office Management
- Associate of Applied Science in Information Systems Specialist
- Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice
- Associate of Applied Science in Paralegal
- Associate of Applied Science in Cosmetology
- Associate of Applied Science in Massage Therapy
- Associate of Applied Science in Respiratory Therapy
- Associate of Applied Science in Surgical Technology
- Associate of Applied Science in Dental Assisting
- Associate of Applied Science in Medical Assisting

Such provisional authorization was contingent upon MJCC continuing progress in addressing specific areas of non compliance with the Chancellor's standards. These recommendations included: enhance the rigor and breadth of its general education curriculum to be consistent with state standards for applied associate degree programs; assess incoming students so that those not ready for college-level work could be placed in developmental courses; improve the credentials of full-time and part-time faculty members to meet the Chancellor's faculty standards; improve the consistency of library services across campuses; demonstrate the sufficiency of sites for clinical placements; and clarify the mechanisms used to measure and improve program outcomes for general education and technical areas. Regularly scheduled progress reports were required as part of this provisional authorization.

On Friday, January 21, 2011, MJCC parent company, Delta Career Education Corporation, notified this office that on behalf of all of Miami-Jacobs Career Colleges in Ohio – including those located in Dayton, Springboro, Troy, Sharonville, Cleveland and Columbus – it was withdrawing its application for authorization of the programs noted above.

The Chancellor concurs with Delta Career Education Corporations decision and accepts the withdrawal of MJCC in the best interest of Ohio citizens.

This action will take effect immediately.
